Time to put your knowledge to work! Use what you've learned to write a short play about making smart choices and resisting peer pressure. Choose one of the scenarios below or come up with your own, and see how many vocab words you can include. Use the back of this page if you need more space to write.

SCENARIOS:

- A student is hurting but is embarrassed. A friend encourages them to speak up and get help from a trusted adult – and it turns out asking for help was the right call!
- Someone finds a pill on the ground and a few friends think it would be funny to eat it. One friend stands firm, says no, and gets an adult instead!
- A friend keeps pressuring someone to take medicine that isn't theirs, saying it will make them feel better. The student knows that taking medicine that was not prescribed to them is never a good idea, no matter what!

VOCAB WORDS:

Medicine - A substance used to treat illness or disease.

Pain - Suffering caused by physical or emotional discomfort.

Peer Pressure - When someone your age pushes you to do something or make a choice.

Prescription - A written order for the use of medicine.

Safe Disposal - Discarding medicine properly so that no one else can use it.

Treatment - Using techniques like medication or therapy to improve illness or disease.

Trusted Adult - A grownup who you know is safe and helpful.
